- general issues related to concepts and interactions between them such as: mathematical creativity, giftedness, creative products, processes and environments, motivation and stimulation, identifying programs and models, educational policies, parents and society;
- 3) teacher issues related to traits, knowledge, skills, competencies, creativity, professional development and the teacher's role as facilitator:
- 4) student issues related to providing possibilities for students' mathematical creativity, examples, successfully applied educational models and examples of good practices.
